- A Pocketful of Crows** Harris, Joanne M. Illus by Bonnie Hawkins. An original modern fairytale centers on a nameless wild girl who is drawn by love into a tamed world of domestic rules, labels and terrible losses before revenge gives her the power to escape.
- Fox 8: A Story** Saunders, George. A keepsake edition of a cautionary fable by the best-selling author of *Lincoln in the Bardo*, previously available only as an ebook, incorporates original illustrations into the whimsical story of a misfit fox with a talent for understanding human language.

**FICTION: General**

- Night of Miracles** Berg, Elizabeth. A baking class instructor, her haunted assistant and a youth reeling from a family tragedy discover the power of community while navigating complicated choices and uncertain futures.
- A Ladder to the Sky** Boyne, John. An aspiring writer meets a celebrated novelist in a hotel in 1988 and uses the man's long-held secret.
- My Sister, the Serial Killer** Braithwaite, Oyinkan. Realizing that her beautiful, beloved younger sister has murdered yet another boyfriend, an embittered Nigerian woman works to direct suspicion away from the family, until a handsome doctor she fancies asks for her sister's number.
- The Rain Watcher** de Rosnay, Tatiana. A patriarch's birthday gathering in Paris is violently disrupted by a natural disaster, revealing to a charismatic young photographer hidden fears and secrets that test the limits of family bonds.
- Bitter Orange** Fuller, Claire. An architect spending the summer of 1969 in a dilapidated English country mansion discovers a peephole that allows her to observe the increasingly sinister private lives of her hedonist neighbors.
- The Kinship of Secrets** Kim, Eugenia. From the author of *The Calligrapher's Daughter* comes the story of two sisters—one raised in the United States, the other in South Korea—and the family that bound them together even as the Korean War kept them apart.
- Those Who Knew** Novey, Idra. From the award-winning author of *Ways to Disappear* comes a timely novel about what a powerful politician thinks he can get away with and the group of misfits who finally bring him down.
- Family Trust** Wang, Kathy. Struggling to fulfill a terminally ill father's final bequest, a privileged Chinese-American family in Silicon Valley is forced to contend with the realities of their ambitions and actual desires.

- Heads You Win** Archer, Jeffrey. A stand-alone epic by the best-selling author of *Kane and Abel* follows a 1968 Russian teen who escapes an oppressive life in Leningrad and is forced to choose between parallel lives in London and New York.
- Master of His Fate, No. 1 (House of Falconer)** Bradford, Barbara Taylor. A charismatic and ambitious businessman in Victorian England faces the tragic ruin of everything he has worked to achieve before a royal summons gives him a chance to prove his talents.
- The Splendor Before the Dark, No. 2 (Nero)** George, Margaret. When a fire engulfs ancient Rome, Nero Augustus is targeted with suspicion about his complicity, forcing him to navigate a web of false friends and spies to save the empire, in a follow-up to *The Confessions of a Young Nero*.

- Marilla of Green Gables** McCoy, Sarah. The *New York Times* best-selling author of *The Baker's Daughter* imagines the life of farm girl Marilla Cuthbert from Montgomery's classic series and describes how premature responsibilities end her dreams and inspire her secret work as an abolitionist.
- The Latecomers** Ross, Helen Klein. From the best-selling author of *What Was Mine* comes a deeply moving family drama about a young Irish immigrant, an ancestral home in New England and a dark secret that lay hidden in its

walls for five generations.

- Jeeves and the King of Clubs: A Novel in Homage to P.G. Wodehouse** Schott, Ben. Brings back P.G. Wodehouse's Bertie Wooster and his incomparable valet, Jeeves, in a new adventure that is full of the hijinks, entanglements, imbroglios and Wodehousian wordplay that readers love.
- Blood Is Blood, No. 10 (Barker & Llewelyn)** Thomas, Will. When an office bombing leaves Cyrus Barker injured, his soon-to-be-wed partner, Thomas Llewelyn, teams up with Barker's long-lost, untrustworthy brother to identify the bombers before an unknown enemy kills off all the suspects.
- Tony's Wife** Trigliani, Adriana. Falling in love during a mid-20th-century Jersey Shore summer, two aspiring singers find their marriage tested when they must decide which of them will pursue career opportunities while the other stays at home to raise a family.
- After the Peace, No. 2 (Spoils of War)** Weldon, Fay. A loving couple, their interfering neighbor and a turkey baster launch the existence of the Honourable Michaela Dilberne, whose resulting life is shaped by her three unconventional parents and over-attentive husband.

- Uneasy Lies the Crown, No. 13 (Lady Emily)** Alexander, Tasha. While the British Empire of 1901 mourns the death of Queen Victoria, Lady Emily and her dashing husband, Colin, investigate a murder in the Tower of London that has been staged to resemble the death scene of Henry VI.
- Homeward Hound, No. 11 ("Sister" Jane)** Brown, Rita Mae. When the Christmas Hunt is interrupted by the discovery of a body, "Sister" Jane Arnold and her company of loyal hounds find their efforts to uncover the truth complicated by the meddling antics of loathsome Victor Harris.
