- The Coming Storm** Alpert, Mark. In a near-future New York City ravaged by rising sea levels, superstorms and scarce resources, a genetic scientist joins forces with a genetically enhanced soldier and a Brooklyn gang kingpin to resist a government plot involving mass DNA manipulation.
